

## PERMANENT IDENTIFICATION FOR YOUR PET

It is a legal requirement for your dog to be identified by a collar and identification disc when out in public places.

Unfortunately these discs can be lost; the only way to permanently identify your pet is by placing an ID chip into the scruff of the neck, between the shoulder blades.

This routine procedure can be carried out by one of our vets without the need for anaesthetic or sedation.

The chip itself is the size of a grain of rice and carries a unique identification number linking the owner's details to the animal. These details are stored on a national database which all veterinary surgeons, dog wardens and rescue centres have access to.

If your pet is found he or she will automatically be scanned for a chip and reunited with you as soon as possible.
